#### **Messages from the Principal**

Our Book Fair last week was a huge success with many children purchasing books that were of interest to them. This shows how much children love to read their own books as much as they enjoy borrowing from the library. Some books are so good you just want to read them again and again and having a small library of books at home creates a love of reading in children from a very young age. Reading is an important part of students learning that needs to be encouraged at every opportunity at home and school.

On Friday we held a fantastic Book Week Parade with most of our students dressing up as their favourite book character. The staff also joined in and entertained everyone with some dramatic performances during the parade. Only one thing was missing today and that was our parents and carers. However, we did manage to get some photos of parents with their children outside the school gate. We look forward to the day when you can all join us again for these special days where we celebrate the joy of learning.

The work we are doing towards developing our Strategic Improvement Plan for 2021-2024 has involved staff, students and parents as we dig deep to get a clear, realistic picture of where our school is at and where we are going to deliver the best learning outcomes possible with the funding we receive each year. We are now using this information to develop our school vision statement and school context statement that form part of our School Improvement Plan. I would like to share some information and insights from the data collected.

#### **Attendance**

It was pleasing to see that our attendance rate is above the State average. However, it is still below our expectations for student attendance every day. Attendance rates have been slowly declining in the last 3 years and from what you told us in our parent surveys, 93% of parents placed attendance at school as very important. In partnership with parents, we need to improve every child's attendance so they are not missing social interactions with peers and the important building blocks of learning that occur each day. Habitual lateness to school also has a huge impact on learning.

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#### Well informed parents

An important opportunity for us was brought to our attention in the parent surveys around improving communication with parents. This was more specifically:

- 1. how we can better inform parents about school activities
- 2. how teachers can better inform and involve parents in student progress

The surveys we ask you to do, as well as opportunities for involvement in focus group discussions, enables you to be involved in the decisions we make. In a couple of weeks, I will be inviting any interested parents to be part of a focus group to discuss and have input to our School Vision Statement for 2021-2024. We already have seven interested parents/carers and would love to have more of you involved in this process. 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

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# School Zone Road Safety

Understanding the roadrules



#### No Parking

A driver must not stop for more than two minutes. You must remain in or within three meters of the vehicle.



#### No Stopping

A driver must not stop in this area.



#### Rue Zone

Vehicles other than buses are prohibited from parking or stopping in this area. Hours of operation may apply. Restrictions apply for those times only.



#### School Zone

40km/h speed limit during hours of operation. Double demerits apply for speed unerices in a schoolzone.



#### Crossings

A driver must stop at the white hold line if pedestrians are waiting to cross. Drivers must remain stationary until the crossing is clear of pedestrians and must obey instructions from School Crossing supervisors.
